| <b>Contest Level Help Sheet</b>  | <p><b>LEVEL 1</b> ('Good' level player)<br/>         This judoka can train and compete with mainstream players. This competitor has a good understanding of the meaning and goal of the competition. All visually impaired players will be divisioned in Level 1 unless they have additional needs. If there are insufficient VI players to make up VI pools they will be allocated to appropriate Level 1 SN pools.<br/>         (CRITERIA: This judoka is very capable of taking part in competition).</p> <p><b>LEVEL 2</b> ('Medium-good' level player)<br/>         This judoka can train and take part in randori with mainstream players. This judoka mostly understands the meaning and goal of the competition.<br/>         (CRITERIA: This judoka is capable of taking part in competition).</p> <p><b>LEVEL 3</b> (Medium' level player)<br/>         This judoka can take part in training with mainstream players<br/>         (CRITERIA: This judoka understands the rules, meaning and goal of the competition.)</p> <p><b>LEVEL 4</b> ('Medium-weak' level player)<br/>         This judoka may only be capable of taking part in special training and competitions.
